
About Us

What are Engineering Apprenticeships?



Engineering Apprenticeships are work-based training programmes that combine on the job training with study. In total, they take around four years to complete and will lead to a nationally recognised qualification.

Apprenticeship Standard Levels



Advanced Level 2 Apprenticeships

Apprentices work towards a work-based qualification such as a Level 2 Competence qualification, Functional Skills and, in most cases, a relevant Knowledge qualification.

(Level 2 is equivalent to 'Semi-Skilled' status)

Advanced Level 3 Apprenticeships

Apprentices work towards a work-based qualification such as a Level 3 Competence qualification, Functional Skills and, in most cases, a relevant Knowledge qualification.

(Level 3 is equivalent to 'Skilled' status)

Apprenticeship Standards



The Apprenticeship standards were developed by employer-led groups to include specific knowledge, skills and behaviours, that will be needed for a specific occupation. This has put the employer in the driving seat and gives the Apprentice a clear path to follow.

These qualifications are designed to help learners develop practical skills needed for everyday life, work, and further education.

Apprenticeship Standards

Knowledge

This is the information, technical knowledge, and 'know-how' that the individual needs to have and to understand, in order to successfully carry out the duties that make up the occupation.

Skills / Competence

Skills are the practical application of knowledge needed to successfully undertake the duties that make up the occupation. These are learnt through on off-the-job training or experience.

Behaviours

Behaviours are mind-sets, attitudes or approaches required for competence, generally across the entire occupation. Whilst these can be innate or instinctive, they can also be learnt, so they are effectively a subset of skills.

Functional Skills

Functional Skills are the essential skills needed for English, and maths, and are vital for young people and adults to participate in life, learning and work.

Gateway End Point Assessment

In the apprenticeship standards, the gateway is the door between the two core stages of the apprenticeship. At the Gateway, the employer, the learner and the training provider would all agree that the apprentice is competent in their job and are now ready to take the next step to prove this.

This is when the learner will then complete the End Point Assessment (EPA). The EPA is the final assessment for an apprentice to ensure they can do the job they have been training for. The EPA is separate to any other qualification or assessment that the apprentice may undertake during the on-programme stage of the Apprenticeship.

The EPA will be conducted by an Independent Assessment Organisation.

Apprenticeship Funding and Service



What is the Apprenticeship Service?

In April 2022, the Government made it a requirement for all companies to use the Apprenticeship service to set up an account and experience the benefits of the Apprenticeship Service.

Through the Digital account the company can reserve the funding for the learner, tailor Apprenticeship training to meet their business needs. All information on how to set up a digital account can be found below however Alliance Learning will also be able to assist.

Funding =

Levy paying company - with a wage bill larger than 3 million per annum your company will be paying into a Digital account where the funds can be used to pay for the Apprenticeship training. The full cost of the qualification will come out of the Digital account.

Non-Levy paying company – If you take on someone who is 16-22 years old, then the training would be fully funded for you.

Government Grant



Employers will receive a £1000 incentive for taking on a 16-18 year old. (£500 at 3 months and £500 at 12 months).
